Yes! Reading is good for EVERYONE! Children and parents alike benefit from the magic of sharing stories together, and here's why.

THE CUDDLE FACTOR

Consider after a long hard day, or two, or three, the toll it takes on you mentally, physically, and emotionally. We sometimes underestimate the negative effects that stress has on our bodies. You may be less patient with others, and you might even find yourself generally irritable and fatigued. Now, close your eyes and imagine those moments that you have experienced with your child snuggled next to you while you read-aloud to them. They point, they comment, and they snuggle in just a little closer. You can feel the stressors of your day and of the outside world melt away. Your body relaxes, your mind stops racing, and a smile dances across your face. Books have the incredible power to bring individuals together, and provide peaceful escapes.

TRICKY SUBJECTS

If you are a parent of a young child, I don't have to tell you that tricky subjects and conversations will pop up regularly. The fact that everybody poops, that dinosaurs don't make good dinner guests, and questions about death and dying are all subjects that get a little tricky when talking with a child, right? We may laugh about dinosaurs at dinner, but my point is that sometimes a parent can use an extra tool in their toolbox to tackle these complicated, or tricky subjects. Books are a valuable resource. A child's core values and beliefs are primarily learned in the home. Books are a magical pathway for parents to use to share life lessons and morals. Readingaloud with a child helps to open the door to conversation, and also strengthen a child's learning and understanding of those tricky subjects.



I recall a time in high school while driving through an old shopping area, when my friend that I was with, randomly shared stories about visits she and her mother made to a little used bookstore that once existed in that particular shopping area. These trips that occurred during her early years were so special to her that she could even recall the specific book titles she took home, vividly! Her mother had made this experience around books a ritual. It wasn't just taking these books home from the store that made these trips so special, but also the feeling of importance and closeness she gained when her mother took her on these trips. Her mother created a sweet bond with her child through books and book collecting that will last a lifetime.

Thanks for allowing me share why I believe that at-home literacy matters, and why reading is good for EVERYONE! I hope that you feel inspired to keep (or begin) the habit of reading-aloud with your child a priority this summer.
