Like most other libraries across California, we are continuing to offer Call Ahead for Pick Up Service, which allows you to call or email the library during open hours to request items for check out. These items will then be waiting for you to pick up from the table in the Library's entrance foyer. Staff can also assist with registering or renewing library cards, printing and any informational questions. Also, remember we have a wealth of resources for you at our ONLINE LIBRARY on the website - including the new HOOPLA Streaming Video service that lets you 'check out' up to 4 movie or TV titles a month!

The Library is actively reviewing options for reopening for limited onsite service as the County trends toward leaving the Purple Tier and vaccinations continue. We hope to have news to share soon. We had to make the fiscally responsible decision to close our Book Chalet storefront. As a result, dozens of boxes of books and video and music media were dispersed throughout the area. The metal shelving was donated to the Mono Basin Historical Society and has been installed in their new auxiliary building adjacent to the School House Museum in Lee Vining.



A Mini Book Chalet has been established inside the Mammoth Lakes Library and will be accessible to us all, when the Library reopens.



The Library we support has done a magnificent job of adapting to our pandemic circumstances. Under the leadership of Head Librarian, Doug Oldham, and County Director, Christopher Platt, almost all Library services have continued - books, newspapers, magazines, no-contact book pick up and a book club.

MLFOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Mammoth Lakes Friends of the Library will offer scholarships annually to Mammoth High School graduating seniors to help purchase books for college. The total amount available to be awarded will be included in that year's approved budget. The number of grants and the dollar amount of the grants will be based on the number of eligible candidates for that same fiscal year.

The following criteria shall apply:

- Students must have an active library card and have used their card to check out materials (not for computer use) during the previous twelve months from the time of application
- Students must fill out the community scholarship request form provided by MHS counseling staff.
- Students must have attended Mammoth High School or the Independent Learning Center (ILC) for 3 out of the 4 years.
- o Students will be selected using Grade Point Average (GPA) as the main criteria, with a minimum of 3.0 GPA. This may be overridden for a student who has been a library volunteer and/or a student who has been a community volunteer above and beyond the required community service requirements, whose or outstanding personal essay merits additional consideration.
- For special consideration, students may volunteer at the library, record their volunteer hours on the form available from the MHS counseling office, and submit the form with their applications.

Procedure:

Each year three members of the Mammoth Lakes Friends of the Library will be chosen as the Scholarship Selection Committee. This committee will request the community scholarship applications from the counseling staff. They will recommend, to the Board, students to receive the book scholarships.

The award will be given by a selected Mammoth Lakes Friends of the Library board member at the MHS Awards Breakfast, which usually takes place on the morning of graduation. At the breakfast, the student will receive a certificate of the award. The student will need to provide proof of registration in college to the Friends of the Library, before the check is written. The proof of registration can be mailed to the Friends of the Library or brought into any scheduled meeting.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

If you happen to pass by the Library, you'll see enclosures are being built for the outside mechanical equipment areas on the north side of the library, thanks to funding provide by the Langston Endowment.

Staff brought this proposal forward after some vandalism this fall, in that someone turned off the propane tank valve and the library had no heat. Other issues have been homeless campers spending evenings in the area and discovering that many of the mechanical connections were never secured.

MLFOL has approved a bid to enclose both areas with metal grids, gates, and a substantial lock/plate system to keep anyone from breaking into the enclosures.

Work is under way, as you can see from the photos below. We are hoping that the project will be completed after the snow melts in the spring.

BOOK CHALET & NEWSLETTER - 2020 - OJ Zeleny

For FY20, the **Book Chalet** had receipts of \$5,535.09 and 851 visitors with expenses of \$7,031.70. This significant loss of \$1,496.61 was due to the coronavirus pandemic resulting in the California Governor shutting down the state in mid-March and the lack of sufficient volunteers to staff the store upon limited re-opening in June. Thus, the MLFOL Board determined, in light of the pandemic's projected resolution, that it was not fiscally feasible to continue operations.

Over two dozen boxes of books and DVDs were given to retirement homes in Bishop, CA. The remaining large/trade fiction paperbacks and all the youth books along with the remaining MLFOL tote bags were collected by Jennifer Crittenden for the annual summer book festival. Furniture and supplies were either stored or given to the Mammoth Lakes library and local non-profits. "Built-in" bookcases remained with the store for a future tenant and the three stand-alone bookcases were moved to Mammoth Lakes library for their use. These latter bookcases along with any vintage books at the store, popular books and those published within the last three years were used to establish the Mini Book Chalet at the Mammoth Lakes library. Librarians will collect funds for books sold at the Mini Book Chalet and MLFOL volunteers will replenish the book shelves.

Names of Book Chalet volunteers since the store's inception were collected by Jo Bacon from OJ Zeleny and Carol Benefiel. These volunteers will be acknowledged via bookplates inside the library's new book arrivals.

For FY20 there were 195 printed **newsletters**; 68 of these were mailed and 136 newsletters were emailed. This is a reduction of 14 mailed and 28 emailed from last year. The newsletter was budgeted at \$235.00 and expenses were \$252.27. This exceeded budget by \$17.27 due to not budgeting prorated cost of printer ink cartridges.

FINANCIAL REPORTS - Jo Bacon, MLFOL Treasurer

With the library closed or at minimal attendance allowed during the pandemic, this year's budget covers just the basic operations. We anticipate expanding services and programs once we are again fully open.

For the first time in many years, we will be using some of our checking account balance to cover anticipated expenses, as is noted in the Retained Cash Flow Revenue line. We have plenty of funds available, as you can see from the Balance Sheet as of September 30, 2020.

WINTER READING CHALLENGE 2021 - Carissa Devine, Youth Library Program Manager

The Mono County Libraries had a successful #WinterRead2021! A total of 64 readers logged 39,525 minutes across the county. That's nearly 700 hours! In Mammoth Lakes specifically, we saw 54 new registrants using the virtual, reading tracker Beanstack, which came largely from MES. In fact, MES had the largest amount of qualifiers for the #WinterRead2021 raffle* across the county!
